deworming 72

Pap smear 10

Breast exam 36

Blood pressure 150

Referral for follow up 1

# Registration

The registration desk was placed strategically so that all those who wanted the services were cleared from there.

Overall we registered377 clients. The desk was allocated the nursing students led by finalist students. They did a great job-Hongera.

## Hypertension screening

We managed to screen more than 150 clients on that day. Most of them had a normal blood pressure. Most ladies had lower BP level and were given thorough health talk

At this desk we were only doing it if necessary because of limited resources. Those with a BMI of above 37 and elderly or those with history of diabetes were given the priority.

We tested more than 100 clients. Out of all these, we referred those with higher sugars to the School clinic for further management. Those with low sugars were also managed and health education
